GOSPEL (Gospel (John 20:19-31)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.

'As the Father sent me so am I sending you.' After saying this he breathed on them and said:

> 'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord,' he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you,' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him:

'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'

There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.

The Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

SHORT HOMILY:

Today, we celebrate **Divine Mercy Sunday**, a feast that flows directly from the heart of Easter. It is the day Jesus revealed Himself again to the disciples in the upper room, offering them the gift of peace and the power to forgive sins. "Peace be with you," He says—not once, but three times. Then, He breathes on them and says, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them."

In this moment, Jesus institutes the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the channel of Divine Mercy in the Church. He does not condemn their past failings—Peter's denial, their abandonment—but offers healing and trust. Even Thomas, full of doubt, is not rejected but invited to touch the wounds of mercy and to believe.

The Acts of the Apostles show us the powerful effects of this mercy: healing, unity, and awe. The early Church became a sign of God's compassion, where even the sick sought the shadow of Peter for healing. Mercy made the Church a place of hope.

In the Book of Revelation, St. John sees the Risen Lord in glory, who declares, "Do not be afraid... I was dead, and now I am alive forever and ever." Divine Mercy reminds us that the victory of Christ over sin and death is for all time. His mercy endures forever.

On this special Sunday, we are called not only to receive mercy but to become ambassadors of mercy—to forgive, to reconcile, to lift burdens, and to reflect Christ's compassion in our homes, our parish, and our world.

Let us pray with trust: "Jesus, I trust in You." And may our trust lead us to share this mercy, especially with those who need it most.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, (At the words that follow, up to and including 'the Virgin Mary', all bow.) who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.
